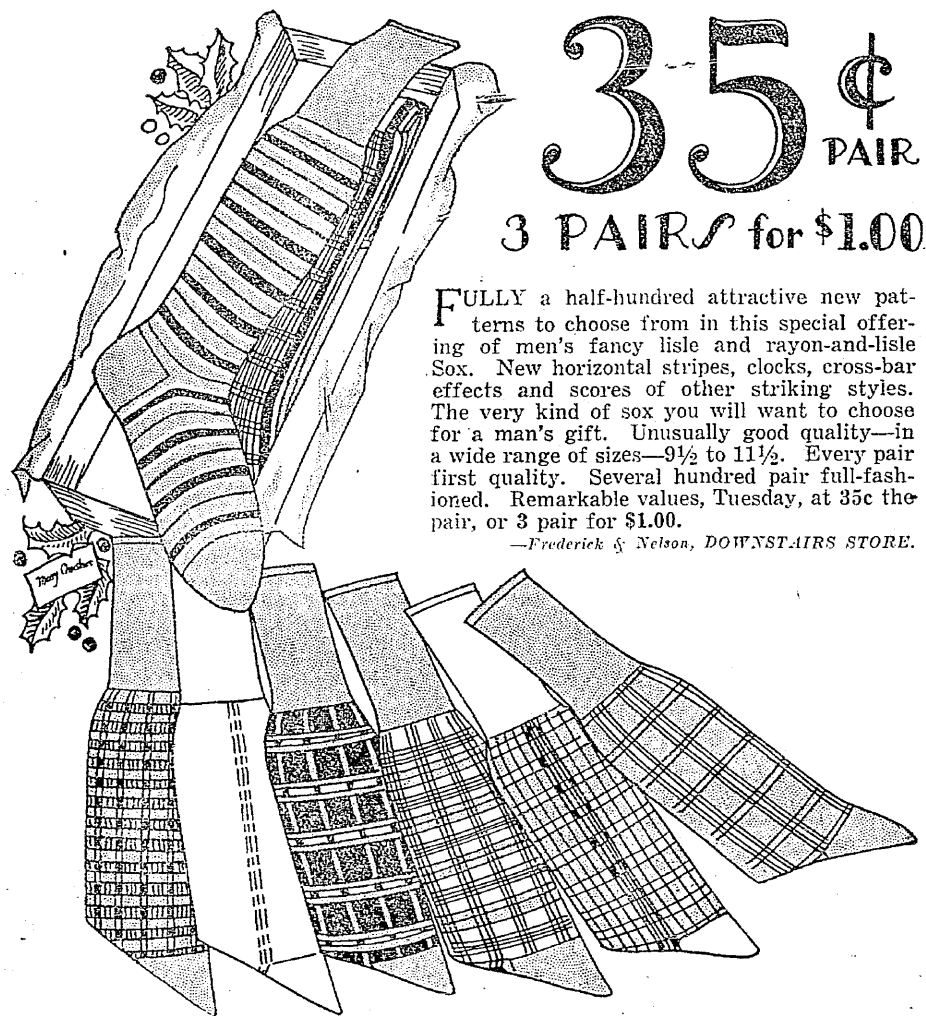

District Attorney Keyes Telegraphs
Chicago to Arrest Fugitive Radloman.

LOS ANGELES, Monday, Dec. 13.—District Attorney Asa Keyes, who is now in Philadelphia on private business, is preparing to extradite Kenneth G. Ormiston, fugitive co-defendant in the Almeida Sempie McPherson conspiracy case.

Mr. Keyes, in a private telegram to The Los Angeles Times, sent last night from Philadelphia, states he had wired State's Attorney Crowe in Chicago, requesting the arrest of the radloman, who is now at liberty in that city.

RED THREADS IN ORMISTON'S CAR LINKED TO WOMAN'S COAT

LOS ANGELES, Monday, Dec. 13.—(P)—Prof. Arthur R. Mass, after a microscopic examination of several tiny, bright red threads, picked from an overcoat found in the automobile belonging to Kenneth G. Ormiston and recently seized in an Oakland garage, has discovered that the strands, at first believed to be from a woman's head, were woolen fibers covered with coal tar dye. The examination further disclosed that the fiber threads were identical with those drawn from the texture of a woman's plaid coat found in Or-

miston's steamer trunk when it was recently seized in New York.

Congregations Honor Cantor Chanukah Feast Is Observed

Joseph Rosenblatt, Formerly of New York Synagogues, Is Entertained at Banquet Held by Likur Cholum.

IN observance of the Feast of Chanukah, 500 members of the Congregation B'nai Cholim last night entertained Cantor Joseph Rosenblatt, one of the leading soloists of their faith, at their annual banquet in the synagogue at Seventeenth Avenue and Yester Way.

For almost four hours the congregation listened to addresses of its leaders and to the solo numbers of Cantor Rosenblatt who, after years of service in the synagogues of New York, is now touring the world, appearing this week in Seattle at the Pastimes Theatre. He was followed by Cantor S. Tovin of the local congregation, one

of the acknowledged leaders in Jewish musical circles on the Pacific Coast.

The current trend of Judaism in Southern California was detailed for the congregation by its leader, Rabbi Simon Winograd, who recently returned from a visit to Jewry in the southern state. P. Allen Rickles presided at the banquet, and Fred Bergman was toastmaster.

Cantor Rosenblatt was greeted upon his arrival in Seattle by a delegation headed by Rabbi Winograd and including Julius Schaeffer, N. Levitt, N. Goodlick, B. Weinstein, Mr. Bergman, Mr. Rickles, Cantor Tovin and A. Dorris.

MEXICAN THROGS IN SAINT DAY WORSHIP

For First Time in History No
Priests Aid in Great Ceremony
for Virgin of Guadalupe.

MEXICO CITY, Monday, Dec. 13.—More than 100,000 persons peacefully worshiped yesterday at the shrine of Mexico's patron saint, the Virgin of Guadalupe. For the first time in history no priests were in attendance. Members of the upper classes rubbed shoulders with hordes of Indian pilgrims from all parts of the republic. Men, women and children, wearing sandals, sombreros and thin cotton garments, made their way slowly along the roads into the great building and past the altar to venerate the saint. Similar ceremonies were held throughout the country.

Because of the multitude the custom of worshiping crawling on hands and knees along the roads toward the church and inside the edifice was prohibited by the laymen serving as directors. The laymen were in charge because since the Mexican government put into effect the religious laws priests have ceased to function in Catholic churches throughout Mexico.

The day was Mexico's holiest day, commemorating the traditional appearance of the Virgin of Guadalupe to a poor Indian four centuries ago.

There were frequent shouts of "Long live Christ, the King," and now and then "Long live the Pope." The authorities had lined the highways with soldiers and police, with heavy reserves nearby but there was no untoward event. Every man and every automobile approaching the shrine was searched by soldiers and police for arms.

raised safety zone or stanchions set in the street.

6—Adoption of a provision prohibiting parking in city business district between 7:30 and 9 a. m. and 4:30 and 6 p. m., which provision would greatly increase the capacity of the streets and relieve congestion during the rush hours.

7—Setting back of the curb on certain north and south avenues, especially Third Avenue. This setting back of the curb on Third Avenue would again make it a traffic and business street.

8—Installation of light gates at schools to be operated by school traffic squads; also the installation of painted words and lines at each school warning of the approach to them.

9—Installation of school children and pedestrian tunnels beneath arterial highways where needed, the approximate cost being \$4,500 per intersection.

10—That the appropriation of \$7,000 to \$8,000 per year be made to maintain adequately the traffic and directional lines, as they have been considered a means of saving lives in all of the cities visited; this appropriation to cover the erection of warning and traffic signs, as the Police Department does not feel it can enforce an ordinance in any location without a proper sign.

Concerning automatic traffic signals Mr. Bolling said he believed bells were necessary for traffic control. He said indications were that signals eventually would be placed invariably on the right hand corner of an intersection instead of in the center. In order to providing uniformity, the putting of signals on the corners would aid in the elimination of overhead wires.

city's fiscal agents in New York not later than February. Although the council frequently causes such loans to be made from one city department to another, there is no statute authorizing it, such authority and a question was raised in the present instance of whether the councilmen are not overstepping their power.

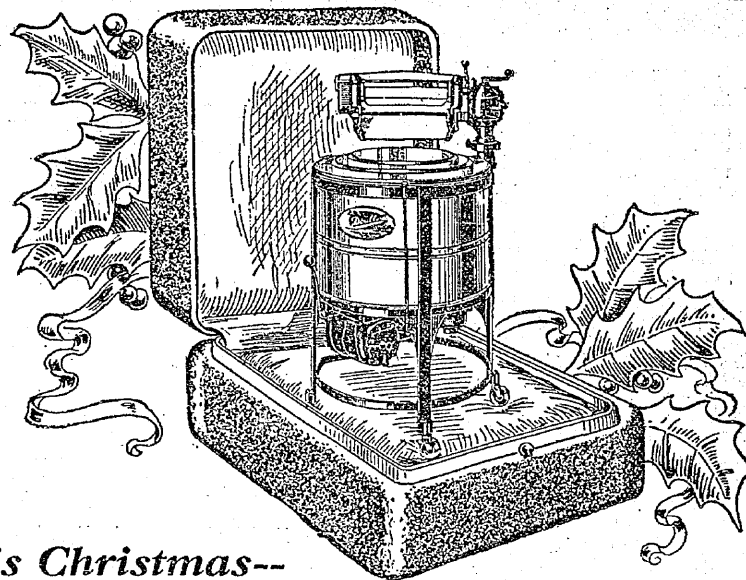
Attitude of Taxpayers.

The question comes from members of the fourteen taxpayers' committee and taxpayers in general, who fear for the safety of Seattle's water and light utilities if the Council runs rampant with their funds, and, moreover, for the integrity of the general fund, raised directly by taxation, to operate the city's numerous departments.

A measure raising the rate of interest to the banks from 2 to 2½ per cent on all city deposits, was to be passed this afternoon.

The city's deposits vary between \$4,000,000 and \$10,000,000. At present they are about \$4,000,000. They are apportioned among various banks on the authority of the city treasurer, subject to approval by the mayor. It has been a custom of the treasurer and mayor to make agreements with the banks the first of each year as to what the allotments will be for a twelve-month period.

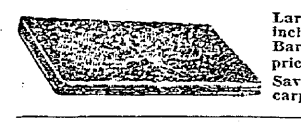

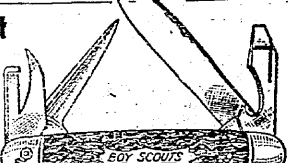

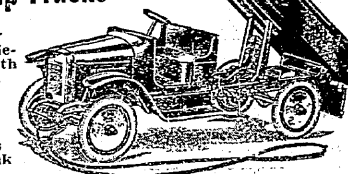
