MEXICAN THRONGS IN

For First Time in History No Priests Aid in Great Ceremony for Virgin of Guadalupe.

More than 100,000 persons peacefully worshiped yesterday at the shrine of Mexico's patron saint, the Virgin of Guadalupe. For the first time in history no priests were in attendance.

Members of the upper classes rubbed shoulders with hordes of Indian pilgrims from all parts of the republic. Men. women and children, wearing sandals, sombreros and thin cotton garments, made their way slowly along the roads into the great building and past the altar to venerate the saint. Similar ceremonies were held throughout the country.

Because of the multitude the custom of worshipers crawling on hands and knees along the roads toward the church and inside the edifice was prohibited by the laymen serving as di-More than 100,000 persons peacefully


