Chairman Abrahamson gave a brief outline of the program, saying that the meeting had been called for the purpose of praying for the victory of the United States in the present conflict with Spain Following Mr. Abrahamson a number of short speeches were made and among the speakers were Mayor Truelsen, Judge McGindley, I.
