FIRE DESTROYS \$10,000 STOCK

Levine Clothing Company Store Gutted—Flames Start From Gas Explosion.

Fire, which is supposed to have been caused by an explosion of gas, destroyed the entire stock of goods at the Levine clothing store, 115- East Superior street, yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock. The loss is estimated at \$10,000.

Recomers in the flat over the store, who were stifting in the apariments at the front of the building when the fire started, heard a muffield explosion from the store below, and immediately and the witchers on the scond fort. Instantly the interior of the clothing store was a mass of flames. The front of the store, which had been blown open by the force of the gate explosion, soon crumbled before the blaze, and the flame interport into action from spreading to the two upper store.

On the second floor, which is occupied by two families, there were several people at the time of the fire. These rushed from the building as soon as the alarm was given.

Soon BS the marm was given. In the flat on the third story, occupled by Mrs. Mis-r A. McCory, there of whom were asleen. Minor of them hurried down to the street in scant attire, one young woman hurrying out the back way into the alley in her bare feet.

The apartments over the store wero not damaged by the fore, but smoke filled the entire building. Thinking the fire was beyong the control of the department, the people in the rear of the flat on the second floor hastily tumbled furniture, carpets and household articles down the back stairs.

II. Levine, manager of the clothing store, values his stock at \$3,000 and says it was insured for \$5,000 The loss to the building, which is a part of the C. II. Oppel block, is estimated at \$2,000. It is fully covered by insurance.
