## QUARRELING BOYS. Herman Jaffe Stabled in the Wide by Henry Elson Last evening at about 9 o'clock Herman Juffe, the 15 year-old son of M. S.

Jafle, a liquor dealer, was stabbed and dengerously hurt, it is alleged by Henry Bloom, the young son of a First-street clothing dealer The boys are students at the night school and for some time there has been had feeling between them. After some words last night Bloom struck Jaffe in

the side with a pen kmile, producing a wound so deep that Dr. McMalion was unable to decide immediately whether or not the kidney had been cut. Young Bloom was arrested and locked up in the city prison. This morning young Bloom appeared in Justice King's court for arraignment.

The father of the injured boy, M. P. Jaffe, also appeared. The latter had already sworn to a complaint charging the defendant with committing an assault with a deadly weapon. At the arraignment, however, he asked that the charge be withdrawn, stating that it was a triffing matter, and

his boy's condition was very much improved this morning. After mature consideration of the matter Justice King granted Jaffe's request

dismissed the complaint, when the defendant was discharged.
