Police Department Doing Its Best Against Gamblers.

NO FAKE GAMES NOW RUNNING

Some Gamblers Remain, and There Seems No Reason for Molesting Them—West Duluthlets

A number of statements have recently appeared to the effect that the gamblers have not all left town. It is an unquestioned fact that several of those who were some time ago connected with the running of gambling houses here are still in the city. The police at the last council meeting were instructed to order all gamblers, fakirs and dog fighters to leave the village. Since that time there have been no complaints of objectionable fake games being run on the streets, and as far as heard from no dog fighters have plied their occupation in this vicinity.

No one seems able to locate a public gambling game of any kind, but a number have recently stated that the gamblers are already to start again. With regard to those who were formerly said to be connected with gambling games here, but whom no one can claim now have anything to do with such institutions the police are at a loss. One of these men is a property owner in West Duluth and resides here with his wife and family. The other two as far as can be ascertained are in no way breaking any municipal law and are injuring no one by their residence. There seems no doubt that the police have for over a month past exercised vigilance in closing out every regular gambling game although until recently they have not molested licensed fakirs.

The opinion among a number of West Duluth citizens that those who are now complaining about the gamblers are doing it simply to have some ground for complaint.
