

NEWS FROM THE IRON MINES

Capt. Chas. Whitford returned on Tuesday from a trip to Cleveland, Ohio, whither he went to consult with Messrs. F. Rockefeller and James Corrigan relative to the exploration of lands in 25-58-17 and 35-58-17, in the vicinity of Ely lake, in which sections the parties have secured low royalty options on elevenforties and which they will explore by test-pitting. capt. Whitford will have charge of these explorations, and the work could not have been given into more experienced hands. The captain has to his credit the successful development of the Franklin, Jones and Moose properties on this range, while from the older ranges he brings an enviable reputation. Work on the new properties will commence at once, and if there is ore on the lands it will be shown up.
