WILL BUILD A FILTER.

The Water Company Has a Scheme for

The Superior Water, Light and Power company has a plan for furnishing the city with filtered water. Last November the water company pur-November the water company purchased two acres of land on Minnesota Point and the scheme is to filter the water through the sand of which the point consists. The contract has been let for putting in the filtering boxes to Bement & Stevens of St. Paul and calls for a completion by June.

The filtration box will be placed 170 feet from the bay shore and will be 330 feet in length and seven feet wide. The main box will be divided into four water tight compartments and each

water tight compartments and each will connect with the intake pipe by separate valves so that any one of them may be shut off for repair at any time and still water enough will be left to to supply the demands of the
