Samuel Karon Plends Gullly to Recelving Stolen Goods.

Samuel Karon yesterday appeared before-Judge Vinje and pleaded guilty to the receiving of stolen property to the amount of less than 30. The sentence he

was to receive was agreed to beforehand and Judge Vinje fined him \$159 and costs. The costs were the heaviest part of the penalty and the total that 'Ir. Karon paid to the court was \$25. Karon was taken before Court Commissioner Steele about six weeks ago. He runs a Junk shop here and it was claim-

ed by the Eastern Minnesota company that he had been receiving stolen property. This property, it was glalimed, consisted of brass, etc., that was taken from the Eastern's yards by some young boys. The company claimed that Karon purchased the material from the boys knowing that they had stolen it. The preliminary hearing before the court com-

missioner occupied in all about two weeks. A large number of witnesses were examined and as several attorneys were ento come up in the council meeting this taken down to be preserved for the court, the costs piled up heavily.

Commissioner Steels found cause to bind the defendant over to the circuit court and 1300 ball was furnished. Karon

Commissioner Steele found cause to bind the defendant over to the circuit court and 1500 bail was furnished. Karon decided finally that, rather than run the risk and expense of trial, he would pical guilty to the charge of receiving stolen goods to the value of not over 130. This made the offense equivalent to petty lar-ceny. Larceny of goods over that amount

would constitute a state's prison offense.
