cans were named: William H. Eaton, mayor; Albert E. Bickford, recorder;

William B. Pratt, treasurer; Gust Johnson, alderman, First ward; Louis Cohen, alderman, Second ward; Her-

bert Burchell, alderman, Third ward; Gust Blomberg, alderman, Fourth ward; and David C. Christopher, justice of the peace. Cohen was the only man who had any opposition in his own party.

The following were named by the

Democrats: A. N. Thompson, Mayor;

Gustaf Nelson, recorder: John Hoveland, alderman, Third ward; and Jacob

Johnson, alderman, Fourth ward. James Sullivan, who had filed his affi-

davit as alderman in the First ward.

did not receive a vote. His filing did

not cost him \$10, however, as the ald-

ermen in Virginia receive no pay for their services.
