Somebody has drawn a glass cutter, 'or diamond, across the entire front of the large front pane on the West side of the main entrance. Not content with that the cutter was drawn in circles on the west side of the pane. The companion big pane of the sast side is also ordanaged by some hard substance, but not so extensively as the other one. The cutting not only mars the appearance of the polished surface, but weakens it and causes it to be more likely to break in case of a strong wind.
