## IS FOUND GUILTY IN PERJURY CASE

M. Edelstein, Who Shipped Goods to Eveleth Will Be Sentenced Tomorrow.

PAUL, Dec. 9.-After half an hour's deliberation, the jury in the case of Morris Edelstein, charged with perjury in connection with proceedings in bankruptcy, returned a verdict of guilty Friday night. Edelstein was accused of having shipped a bill of goods to Eveleth, Minn., to defraud creditors. He denied doing so under oath before referee in bankruptey. Doran. The defense admitted that the that the goods belonged to J. A. Clapp, an eastern dealer, who had left the goods with Edelstein to be sold on commission.
