The prisoner will be sentenced this afternoon for assault in the second degree, the process being stayed yesterday to await the receipt of a letter from the county attorney's assistant, who is familiar with the circumstances of the case.

William B. Hunt and Emil Jalanen were examined by the grand jury and discharged.

The grand jury inspected the jail and found it much more sanitary than when the last jury visited it several months ago. Tolist rooms were recently installed and the cell roms and kitchen have been painted by the prisoners with no other expense to the county than the cost of material. A favorable report of the condition of the jail was made to the court.
