Prices of Stocks Again Decline From Three to Seven Points.

WHOLE LIST UNSETTLED

The state of the s

Weakness Follows Announcement of Big Industrial Failure and Rumors of Financial Embarrassment in High Quarters.

New York, Aug. 15.-Following dull and narrow morning session the stock market broke violently during the afternoon with losses in the active issues reaching from 8 to 7 points and even greater losses in the special issued a marriage license to Adolph group.
