

PROFIT SHARING SUIT IS UP BEFORE JURY

The profit-sharing suit of Joseph Sicard against L. Albenberg & Co. and the Albenberg company was taken up before a jury in the superior court yesterday. At the closing hour Max Albenberg, a brother of Louis Albenberg, the head of both concerns, was on the witness stand. He will resume the stand this morning.

Sicard seeks to recover \$4,850 as his alleged share of profits while acting as manager for the defendant concerns. The dry goods houses are defended by Louis Albenberg, who is the owner of the concerns according to the evidence in the case. Considerable book accounts are being introduced in evidence.

Max Albenberg was summoned by the plaintiff. He gave evidence to show Sicard's relations with the concerns, together with testifying as to the business done by them. Plaintiff will probably finish its side of the case this morning. W. P. Crawford appears for Sicard and H. W. Dietrich for the defendant concerns.
