

SCHOOLS TO END WORK THIS WEEK

More Than 250 Graduates, Grade and High, Will Receive Diplomas.

With but five days left to complete the school year, students and educators of the public schools of the city have a busy week in sight. Some of the schools have held their graduating exercises and will be present at the ceremonies attendant to the graduation of fellow students at other schools. A total of 186 students will receive eighth grade diplomas in addition to 80 high school graduates.

The exercises of the week will begin at 10:30 o'clock this morning when Rev. H. W. Knowles will deliver the baccalaureate sermon to the senior classes of the Blaine and Nelson Dewey high schools at the East End Presbyterian church. On Thursday evening the high school graduates will receive their diplomas at the close of the commencement exercises to be held at the Grand Opera house.

The Nelson Dewey senior class will give their annual class day exercises at the assembly room of the school on Tuesday evening. Graduating exercises will be held at the Peter Cooper school next Wednesday evening. A program of song and music has been prepared for the event.

The Lincoln school graduating class will hold their exercises on Thursday afternoon. A feature of the exercises will be a rendition of "Hagar" by Miss Florence Flinn who recently won first honors in the state declamatory contest. School Commissioner Louis Hanitch will present the diplomas to the graduates at this school.

A musical program will be rendered at the graduating exercises of the Bryant school to be held on Wednesday evening. School Commissioner Potter will present the diplomas. The Howe school graduating exercises will be held on Thursday evening. Delos Kellogg president of the class will deliver an address. The class prophecy will be given by John Raaflaub. Ruth Coleman is the class valedictorian. The Nelson Dewey grades will hold their exercises at the school Monday evening. Prof. A. M. Royce of the Normal will deliver the principal address.

Rev. John W. Powell of Duluth will deliver an address on "Lincoln" at the Blaine graduating exercises to be held at the assembly room of the school Tuesday evening. The Carpenter school graduates held their exercises last week. There will be no graduating class from the Kimball, Franklin and Webster schools this year.
