According to the leading fashion magazines nets and all-overs will be in greater demand than ever. This demand is due to their use for transparent undersleeve and guimpe purposes in lingerie frocks as well as to the number of evening gowns of which they form a part. One of the most popular designs in all-over is a pattern of somewhat large and heavy flowers placed at regular intervals and connected by slender vine tendrils. In nets we meet with Valenciennes and Venice ideas. Hexagen mesh is also popular both in the plain coarsenet and as a finer foundation for the fancy pattern.

In trimmings we find the greatest demand for the metallic braids, a demand that will undoubtedly continue through next fall and winter. Every gown must have some gold, silver, steel or copper braids or trimmings on it and every hat or wrap shows glimpses somewhere of these metallic trimmings. Many two toned metal novelties are being shown and these are even more popular than the single toned effects.

In Paris the greatest novelty of all trimmings are buttons in the design of chanticlers, or as we know them roosters. These designs were brought into prominence by the play called "The Chanticler," where all the performers represented denizens of the barnyard.
