

SUGAR THEFT CASE IS GIVEN CONTINUATION

As a result of the filing of a physician's certificate to the effect that H. Bernstein, one of the defendants in a case charging the theft of 13 sacks of sugar, valued at \$70, from a car at the Twohy-Eimon Mercantile company's storehouse, was ill, the continuation of the trial of Bernstein and H. Goldfine, his alleged accomplice, was yesterday adjourned in municipal court until Sept. 1.

Following the adjournment of the case, Assistant District Attorney Arch McKay moved the dismissal of the charges of receiving stolen goods, which had been entered against I. Dorf and Charles Arnovich, his partner, as a result of their having purchased the sugar which is the basis of the other case. The state has already put in its evidence against Goldfine and Bernstein and it was then shown, to the satisfaction of the assistant district attorney, that Dorf and Arnovich should not be held.
