

GERMAN MINER IN JAIL AT CHISHOLM

Alleged He Attempted to Assault
Mrs. Sol Rubloff, Who Is
Prostrated at Her Home.

CHISHOLM, Nov. 7.—Frank Rontashau, a German miner 25 years old, who has been employed at the Monroe mine, is being held in the city jail, pending investigation of an alleged attempt to assault Mrs. S. Rubloff, living at the corner of Third and Maple streets, Saturday night. Rontashau, it is said, was in a beastly state of intoxication. He says that he did not know what he was doing, and remembers nothing of the affair. The case will probably go to the grand jury.

The police department has been investigating for several days and the news of the incident was made public for the first time today. According to Mrs. Rubloff, Rontashau effected an entrance to her home and attacked her. She succeeded in keeping him at arm's length until her screams attracted Dr. Graham, who was passing, and he came to her rescue. Rontashau was overpowered by the physician, ejected from the house, and a telephone call sent for the police. Before they arrived Rontashau, it is alleged, again attempted to gain entrance, and in so doing shattered several windows.

Mrs. Rubloff is confined to her home as the result of the fright she received and will not be able to appear against Rontashau for several days.
