

ROKOSKI HELD FOR ASSAULT

Man Who Beat Neighbor Woman
Will Be Tried in Superior
Court—Gives Bail.

After a trial lasting two days John Rokoski, accused of beating Mrs. Minnie Goldfine about three weeks ago in the lot back of their homes which adjoin on lower Hughit avenue, was bound over to the superior court by Judge Parker in municipal court yesterday afternoon. The charge on which he is held is that of assault with intent to do great bodily harm.

The trial was lengthened considerably by the necessity of having interpreters for the principal witnesses for both prosecution and defense. Attorney H. C. Wilson, who appeared for Rokoski, at the conclusion of the state's side of the case, made a plea for the discharge of his client, claiming that the charge had not been proven and that little more than a simple assault, if that, was shown. Judge Parker held that where it was shown that an offense of the character charged was committed that he would have to bind over and so denied the motion. Assistant District Attorney Kennedy appeared for the state. Rokoski was allowed to furnish cash bail.
