## COMPLY WITH LATEST LAW

Duluth Men File Certificates of Co-Partnership With Clerk of District Court.

MEASURE PASSED AT LAST LEGISLATIVE SESSION Firms Conducting a Commercial Business Must Designate

Names of the Owners.

Max Zalk, Hyman Y. Joseph and Louis Zalk are the first to comply with the law passed at the recent session of the legislature regarding the filing of certificates by parti-s conducting a co-partnership. They filed with the clerk of the district

court yesterday certificates that they were doing business under the name of the Duluth Machinery com-pany and the Duluth Iron & Metal

pany and the Duluth Iron & Netai company.

The law which called for this filing of certificates is House File No. 355, which says that no person or persons may conduct a commercial business under any designation, name or style which does not set forth the result of the district of the district court a certificate setting forth the name under which the business is to be transacted and the names of the persons conducting the names of the persons conducting the business with their postoffice ad-dresses. To new concerns this must be done before business can be start-ed. Those who have been in business

ed. Those who have been in business must comply with the law within 90 days after its passage. The bill was approved on April 19. In every change of ownership of the business there must be filed a new certificate, the law says. Until this is done thosenamed in the certificates previously filed are liable for certain credits. The law states that this bill does not be succeeded to the certificate or foreign, nor to co-partnerships in which one of the individual names of all members appear in the co-partnerships designation. partnership's designation. The men who filed yesterday have been in business five years. All have until July 19 in which to file their certificates and it is expected that there will be many visiting the district clerk's office in the next few

weeks.
