

SCHOOLS TO OPEN ON SEPTEMBER 5

Nashwauk Has 350 Eligible Pupils, Keewatin 196—Four Additional Teachers.

NASHWAUK, Aug. 27.—Supt. H. A. Gilruth, of district No. 9, which takes in the schools at Nashwauk and Keewatin, announces that the fall term will open Sept. 5, and that the following teachers will be in charge of the various grades:

Nashwauk school—H. A. Gilruth, superintendent; Mabelle Hudson, history and literature; Lucy Bonnell, domestic science; Ray Junkman, manual training; R. M. Gilbert, agriculture; Charlotte, seventh and eighth grades; Sybil Johnson, fifth and sixth grades; Laura Hamblin, intermediate grades; Zita Doran, fourth grade; Gertrude Ponsford, third grade; Mabel Kirchgessner, second and third grades; St. Clair Nesbitt, second grade; Estelle Chase, first grade; Sadie Barrett, special first grade; Elizabeth Shepardson, kindergarten; Helen Plant, kindergarten.

Keewatin school—W. K. Morris, principal; Lester Prairie, eighth grade; Eva Hathaway, fifth, sixth and seventh grades; Grace Vipond, third and fourth grades; Genivieve Canary, second grade; Clara Randall, first grade; Lucile Norris, kindergarten.

A census of the district has been taken by Superintendent Gilruth and he finds there are 350 children in Nashwauk, who are eligible for enrollment in the schools and 196 at Keewatin. Only eleven teachers were employed last year, which means that four additional have been added on account of the increased number of pupils. A meeting of the teachers will be held at Nashwauk on Monday, Sept. 4, at which Superintendent Gilruth will outline the year's work.
