To All Saloon Keepers of the City of Virginia and To Whom It May Concern.

YOU WILL PLEASE TAKE NOTICE. That under the provisions of the City Ordinances of Virginia and of the laws of the saloons be kept closed and that all persons be excluded therefrom between the hours of eleven o'clock P. M. and five o'clock A. M. of each week day, and shall be closed on the Sabbath Day and all general and special election days. The city ordinances further require that the room where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be sold shall be so arranged that the entire bar thereof may be in view from the street, and no screen, blind or obstruction to this view. shall be placed or erected so as to prevent an entire view of the bar from the street during the time when a saloon is required

to be closed.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the provisions above specefied will be strictly enforced and within ten days from date all saloons within the city must be so arranged to conform to the provisions of the above ordinance so that the full view of the bar may be had from the street during the time said saloon is required to be closed.
