

CITY IS NOT LIABLE In report on the alleged damages in the sum of \$5,000 claimed by Mrs. Margaret Devine and the sun of \$1,000 claimed by her husband, Thomas Devine, also in the matter of the claim for \$5,000 damages filed by Matt Mattson, City Attorney Poirier notified the council Tuesday evening that he did not consider the city responsible in any manner for the alleged

injuries and resultant damages. Mrs. Devine claims to have been injured by falling on an icy walk Mattson alleges he fell on an icy roadway on the North Side, both sustaining injuries which they considered could be healed for the sum named. Thomas Devine alleges the injuries to his wife, resulting in a broken leg, are worth the sum of \$1,000 to him.

The report of Attorney Poirier. which was accepted and ordered filed, puts it up to the individuals to take some means of proving their claim, if they so desire.
