

HAVE A CARE HOW YOU CALL POLICE

In these cold days it is not always the right caper to call for police assistance even if you are in a tight corner. Be sure you are right, then go ahead. This is the advice of E. Gershgal, a Russian Jew of Duluth, who called for police assistance and instead was hauled up himself. Yesterday he paid a fine of \$5 and costs in municipal court for peddling without a license.

It appears that Gershgal, who is a dairyman of Duluth, received a lot of fish in payment for services rendered. The sea food did not particularly appeal to him and he devised a way to get rid of it which would net him a little profit. Coming over to Superior he was exhibiting his stock in a boarding house on lower John avenue, with a view of disposing of some of it. Not being familiar with the different species of fish he exhibited a mackerel, which he termed "lutefisk."

Jews don't usually sell Norwegian delights and a roughhouse was started. Gershgal was getting the worst of it when he called the police, while his companion drove off with the wagon of fish. The police arrived and when questioning him as to what he was doing there he said he was selling fish. He was arrested on a charge of peddling without a license. He admitted his offense and paid a fine. He then swore out a warrant for the arrest of John Rine, who was arrested yesterday on a charge of assault and battery. His case was set over until Tuesday.
