iles Score Cards With City Health Department, **Showing Condition** of Shops.


C. M. Campbell, chief food and meal inspector, yesterday submitted to inalth Officer O. K. Judd his scoring of the meat markets and bakeries in Little Rock for the month of November. The scoring consists of the grading of the equipment and methods of work in these establishments, the condition of the utensils and tools used in them, the surroundings of the places, with a view to ascertaining their sanitary conditions.

Meat markets, bakeries and dairies will be inspected every month, this become the first report on the subject by The Health Department. After each place has been graued a score card, showing the condition of everything examined, is left with the owner, to enable him to make above a recovery to able him to make changes necessary to improve the sanitation of his place. According to the grading, 90 to 100 denotes that the place examined is in excellent condition; 80 to 90, good; 70 to 80, fair; 60 to 70, medium; below 60,




