

WILL LOOK FOR MARKET SITE

Eveleth Council Appoints a Committee to Arrange for Location—Build New Sewers.

EVELETH, Feb. 7.—At the meeting of the city council last night the committee on public buildings, consisting of M. E. Nichols, J. M. Trovarrow and J. S. Wilson, was instructed to take up the matter of a market place for Eveleth with the view of finding a suitable location. The subject was brought to the attention of the council by Solomon Sax as chairman of the committee appointed for the purpose by the Commercial club. The committee on public buildings was also instructed to make provision for the remodeling of the present city hall. The completion of the new fire hall will remove the fire department from the present quarters, necessitating a remodeling of the old building. Sketches will probably be submitted at a meeting of the council to be held in the near future.

A claim was received from Samuel Levant for \$131 for damage done to the contents of his basement on Grant avenue by breaking of a water main. The matter was referred to the city attorney. A fire horse was purchased from Charles Jesmore for the sum of \$325. The city printing contract was let to the Eveleth News, being the only bidder at 50 cents per folio for first and 23 1-3 for subsequent insertions. The report of the health commissioner showed 20 births during January with only five deaths. The monthly payroll amounting to \$3,633.04 was allowed. The annual report of the health commissioner, which contained much interesting statistical data, was ordered published. This was the first report of the kind ever made in Eveleth. The Miners' National Bank and the First National Bank of this city were named as depositories for city funds to be divided equally between each bank, the banks to give bonds in the sum of \$25,000 each. The banks will pay 2 per cent on deposits. A sleigh was ordered purchased for the waterwork's department for use of officials in going to and from the waterworks plant. The amount was \$65 and will be purchased from William Murray of this city.

Instructions were given to the city clerk to advertise for 1,350 feet of sewer and water mains to be laid on Harrison street and avenue and also advertise for the sale and removal of the old water tank on property opposite Glode hotel.
