

CHRISTIANS HEAR RABBI IN CHURCH

Pastor of Temple Emanuel Deliv-
ers Lecture on Zionism in Bap-
tist House of Worship.

Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits of the Temple Emanuel gave an address yesterday morning on "Zionism" at the Central Baptist church, Twentieth avenue west and First street. He defined the object of the movement as one which was to lead to the establishment of a Jewish nation in Palestine in which Jews of the world might live.

The Jews, he said, had for 1,800 years been looking forward to and praying for the restoration of Palestine to them. While the wish has been strong among the people, he said, no direct action had been taken by them until the start of the Zionism movement.

"The close of the nineteenth century," said Rabbi Lefkovits, "has caused a reawakening of the Jews to their own individuality. They have come to realize that they are not to be driven from pillar to post, that they should be organized as a nation."

The speaker said he believed that as a scattered nationality the Jews had a peculiar mission to the world. The opponents of Zionism, he said, have urged many reasons why they should not be assembled again in Palestine, the principal being that the land was not fertile enough to support them and that the mission of their God would not be served.
