

REFORM SENTENCE FOR HOUSE LOOTER

Emory Hahn Is Given Term at St. Cloud—Second-Hand Dealers Fined.

Emory Hahn, aged 24, was given an indeterminate sentence at St. Cloud reformatory yesterday in district court by Judge Dancer.

He was arrested several days ago charged with entering houses, the owners of which were temporarily absent and making away with what valuables he could find. When searched several pass keys were found in his possession. He entered a plea of guilty.

Abe Winer and Joe Vertelney, second hand dealers on the Bowery, entered a plea of guilty to the charge of purchasing junk from minors and were fined \$25 each and costs.

Winer and Vertelney were charged with purchasing a pair of skates from August Bjorklund, the 16-year-old boy who admitted to the police that he and Earl Linkem, aged 12, had stolen from the check room of the skating rink on Fourteenth avenue

east. The skates were valued at \$1 and Bjorklund claimed he received only 50 cents.

Both men waived examination when arraigned in municipal court and were bound over to the grand jury.
