

PLACED ON TRIAL CHARGED WITH LARCENY OF TENTS

Charged with the theft of several tents from the Beck livery barns, Joe Weston was placed on trial in Superior court yesterday and the case will probably be ready for the jury some time. Mr. Cary M. Wilson is appearing for Weston and District Attorney Arch McElroy is prosecuting.

The tents involved in the case were brought into court and spread about the floor, giving the room much the appearance of a house that is "enjoying" the usual spring cleaning and restoration. They are alleged to have been taken by Weston and sold to I. Averbook, a second-hand dealer. At the trial yesterday Averbook and Detective W. A. Meade, who located and recovered the tents, were the principal witnesses for the state.
