Gardner yesterday were State Chairman McArthur, Sen. Wesley C. McDowell of Marjon, George P. Jones of LaMoure, Col. George W. Wilkinson, A. M. Mack of Marjon and others. All internal strife in the state or-ganization between the two factions headed by Mr. McArthur and Colonel Wilkinson, it is said, has been patched up and both the state chairman and the editor of The Democrat are now reported to be working side by side in perfect harmony for the good of the party. Their past differences, it is whispered in political circles, have

As for the distribution of federal jobs, the outcome is still a little different. There are forty applicants almost for each job and President Wilson is going to face just as much of a problem in distributing the federal offices among the North Dakota democrats as Governor Hanna was up against with the hungry republicans when he took office in January.

Hellstrom of the state penitentiary. Mr. Doyle is said to have the endorsement of Senator Purcell of Wahpeton. State Chairman McArthur is also mentioned among the possibilities for the place, but his candidacy has not been announced nor yet taken any






