

HEBREWS TO HAVE A PARISH SCHOOL

Building Will Cost \$20,000 and
Will Be Erected During
Present Year.

Duluth will have a Hebrew par-
ochial school if the plans of the di-
rectors of the Moses Montefiore He-
brew school materialize. At a bar-
quet of all those interested last Sat-
day night in the vestry rooms of the
Adas Israel synagogue, Third street
East and Third street, the work of
getting money was formally begun.

To obtain funds for the erection of
a modern structure for the school, a
contribution list was circulated with
the result that on Sunday night
\$1,800 was promised. Among those
who donated \$100 or over are I.
Oreckovsky, \$300; Charles P. Myers
\$200; Mrs. Ida Cook, \$200; G. Oreck
\$100; Joseph Weinburg, \$100, and
Pollnsky, \$100.

It is planned to purchase a lot
and erect a structure next summer.
The building will cost about \$20,000
and in addition to class rooms and
offices will contain a gymnasium with
complete equipment. An increase in
the number of teachers will also be
made.

In the school now conducted in the
synagogue building. Professor I.
Horwitz has two assistants. Nearly
200 students attend daily.

Joseph Oreckovsky, who was ap-
pointed temporary chairman of the
building fund, announced yesterday
that a meeting will be held next Sat-
day evening at the synagogue to per-
fect the plans for going ahead with
the work.

He expressed himself as well
pleased with the start and gave it as
his opinion that it would not be dif-
ficult to raise the remainder of the
fund if all Jewish citizens supported
the movement.
