SERVICES CONCLUDED

Duluth Jews Conclude Observation of Yom Kippur in Synagogue and Temple.

Yom Kippur, or Day of Atonement services, came to a close last night at sundown when orthodox Jews of Duluth heard the final blast from the Shofar (ram's horn).

Services were conducted in the morning and afternoon at Temple Emanuel, Seventh avenue East and Second street, by Rabbi Maurice Lefkovits and at Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street.

Special musical programs were offered at each. At Temple Emanuel, Rabbi Lefkovits' sermon in the morning on "Sin and Punishment," was an especially powerful one, dealing with the features of the Day of Atonement and emphasizing the idea that God desires the sinner to live rather than die for his sins.
