

LOUIS GOLDISH DIES FROM BLOOD POISONING

Louis Goldish, age 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. David Goldish, 208 East First street, who was injured Saturday at Daisy dock, Superior, when the steamer Goldish was attempting to dock, died yesterday morning in St. Francis' hospital, Superior. Death was due to blood poisoning in a wound Goldish received when caught by a rope, which cut a gash in his legs. The funeral was held from the Grady & Horgan undertaking rooms at 2 p. m. Interment was in the Jewish cemetery.

Goldish was born and educated in Duluth. For the last two years he was in charge of his father's fish business, and made regular trips with the steamer along the north shore.
