THE MAGBIAH CLUB is a recent addition to the list of organizations in this city that has improvement of social conditions as their goal. The Magbiah—meaning as translated from the Hebrew, "He That Uplifts," is an organization of young Jewish girls that has as its aim the moral, mental, social, physical and religious improvement of the Jewish young people of the city.

Taking as their motto the text: "Love thy neighbor as thyself," the Magbiah club will begin today a series of social Sunday afternoons that will bring the Jewish young girls of the city together socially and that will be the forerunner of systematized social center work.

Mrs. S. Goldberg has been active in organizing the girls into the Magbiah society, realizing the need that exists for such an organization. Until the present time there had been nothing done to bring the Jewish girls together in a society, and it is felt that much helpful work may be done in the kindly spirit of sisterhood, especially for the girl who has but recently come to America and is unfamiliar, in many cases, with the new language and customs. The club will cooperate with the Associated Charities, and will endeavor

to improve the social conditions of the Jewish girls who are factory workers.

Officers of the Magbiah club are Miss Irene Wetzler, president; Miss Bessie Markovitz, first vice president; Miss Hazel Levin, second vice president; Miss Enid Freimuth, recording secretary; Miss Eva Zalk, corresponding secretary; Miss Anna Mark, treasurer; Miss Selma Oreckovsky, historian. The press committee includes Miss Stella Bondy, Miss Bertha Mendelsohn and Miss Jeannette Gombberg.

The initial social Sunday afternoon will be a Washington party and will be held at Temple Emanuel, Seventh avenue East and Second street, at 3:00 o'clock. Miss Sally M. Oreck, Miss Sadie Berkson and Miss Sadie Rocklin are in charge of the program. At the tea tables will be Miss Hortense Bondy and Miss Fannie Altman, the assisting hostesses being Miss Sophia Weinstein, Miss Sarah Nusbaum and Miss Belle Karon.

The program will include a piano solo by Miss Sadie Gingold; readings by Miss Lena Rocklin; an address by Dr. M. Lefkovits, and a violin solo by Henry Lavick. Miss Eva Zalk will be at the piano for Mr. Lavick's solo.
