

MANY LIGHTS FOR AERIAL BRIDGE

B. Silberstein Announces That
1,442 Incandescents Will Be
Donated by Two Duluthians

IMPROVEMENT COST
WILL BE NEARLY \$6,000

Bulbs to Be Placed on Every Beam
of Structure—Retail Mer-
chants Interested

Duluth's aerial bridge will be illuminated by myriads of electric lights in the near future, according to an announcement made yesterday by B. Silberstein of the Retail Merchants association, who has been active in obtaining the improvement for the city.

"I am not at liberty to announce the names of the two citizens who have consented to furnish the entire equipment without a cent of cost to the city or any organization," said Mr. Silberstein. "Their names will, however, be made public at the next meeting of the association when they will attend and give the details of the proposed plan. Their offer is a generous one and should not be allowed to pass unnoticed."

The plans and specifications for the proposed lighting system show the use of 1,442 bulbs placed at regular intervals along every beam in the massive structure. The cost of the equipment is estimated at between \$5,000 and \$6,000.

"I also believe that the electricity for the bridge may be secured free of cost," continued Mr. Silberstein. "I am not prepared, however, to speak on that feature. I can definitely state that the lights will be installed on the bridge on the next few months."
