of 1912, the largest freshman  
class ever entering the

number dropping out, it still  
remains the largest of any  
senior class.

will of the girl members.  
Debating and oratory have  
come in for their share

of patronage by the mem-  
bers of the class, and the  
standard of these studies  
have been raised materi-  
ally since they began these  
branches. Taking every-  
thing into consideration the  
outgoing class has a record  
to be proud of, and one  
that will stand for many  
years.

The class also has a

Miss Agnes E. Wells,  
advisor, said in regard to
