

MAKE PLANS FOR HERZL MEMORIAL

Will Be Second Exercises of the
Kind Ever Held in
Duluth.

Announcement of the complete program for the ninth Herzl memorial, Sunday July 27, was made last night by the committee in charge.

Rabbi I. S. Teplitz, head of the local orthodox Jewish congregation, will deliver an appeal for Zionism in Yiddish, taking his text from Isaiah III, 7—"How beautiful are up on the mountains the feet of the messenger of good tidings, that publisheth peace, that announceth tidings of happiness, that publisheth salvation, that saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth."

Probably one of the most solemn and impressive hymns known in synagogal music is the Memorial hymn, which will be chanted by H. Zion.

"Herzl and the Lesson He Taught Us," will be the subject of the principal address, which will be delivered by Benjamin Herwitz, Ph. D., post-graduate of Columbia university, and son of Rev. and Mrs. E. Horwitz, 221 East Third street.

While Ohave Zion Gate, No. 19, Duluth, has announced the coming memorial for Dr. Theodore Herzl as the ninth, the exercises to be conducted at Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street, will be the second of the kind ever held in Duluth. This is due to the fact that until A. Mordecai Shulman, formerly of Duluth, but now of Chicago, organized the local gate little had been done in the movement. The local gate is nearly three years old.

Last year the memorial address was delivered by Max Shulman, a prominent Chicago attorney, who is grand master of the Order of Knights of Zion. The Shulmans are cousins and are numbered among the most ardent Zionists in the movement.
