America their permanent home. We

have them come by way of Galveston where our agents advise them as to the most suitable places to locate. The local committee which has been working with the Galveston office is composed of Dr. Maurice Left. Kovits, chairman; H. Y. Josephe and

B. J. Cook. Nearly 100 families have been sent to Duluth by the Texas bureau.
