

HELPING JEWS IN FINDING HOMES

Immigrant Bureau Manager in
Duluth to Confer With Local
Men in Work.

"Russia is a veritable hell for the Jews and conditions there are worse by far than they were 10 years ago," said Henry Berman, manager of the Jewish Immigrants' Information bureau, with headquarters in Galveston, Texas. Mr. Berman was in Duluth yesterday on his way to the Twin Cities after an inspection of the work of his bureau in the middle west.

The bureau has been instrumental in locating 7,000 Jewish families in western cities.

"It is our purpose," said Mr. Berman at the Holland, "to bring over to this country pioneer types of Jews who are able to do manual labor; who desire to make America their permanent home. We have them come by way of Galveston where our agents advise them as to the most suitable places to locate."

The local committee which has been working with the Galveston office is composed of Dr. Maurice Lefkowitz, chairman; H. Y. Joseph and B. J. Cook. Nearly 100 families have been sent to Duluth by the Texas bureau.
