

WORKMAN ASKS DAMAGES FOR INJURY TO HAND

Trial of an action for \$5,025 damages against the Duluth Iron and Metal company demanded by Axel Anderson was begun before a jury in Judge Dancer's division of the district court yesterday. Anderson said he was inexperienced and was put to work unloading scrap iron from a car. A heavy piece of metal fell on his hand and amputated two fingers. He says the company was negligent in failing to give him a safe place to work and to warn him of the dangers incident to his employment.
