## WOMAN ASKS \$5,000 Damages from city

Mayor Gleason of Eveleth Declares He Will Enforce Health Ordinances Rigidly.

damages amounting to \$5.000 was
presented to the council at its meeting this evening by Mrs. Feluna
Kauppinen who declares she fell on
a slippery sidewalk and injured her
wrist and arm, and received various
other internal hurts.

Frank Weyenberg was appointed health officer and Mayor Gleason in making the appointment stated it was his intention to see the city promptly

cleaned up.
"I will take drastic measures, if necessary." said the mayor, "to enforce the health ordinances as re-

gards the cleaning up of back yards and lots."

The proposed annexation of the Fayal and Spruce locations was dis-

cussed at the meeting as residents from both had made application to be taken into the city in order to secure better roads and water supply.

A representative of the Burns-Mc-Donald company of Kansas City addressed the council concerning the proposed appraisal of the electric

light plant in the city, which the city pray decide to take over. A special necting to discuss the matter more fully has been called for tomorrow afternoon. The roads leading from the city

to the pumping station are in such bad condition that bids had to be called for, to get two 16-ton bollers hauled out to the pumping station. Two bids were received, one being \$890 and the other \$826. Both were turned down by the council which decided they were too high even in spite of the terrible condition of the roads
