

SAID MAN PASSED \$1 COUNTERFEIT

Henry Haronimus Arrested on Charge of Passing Spur- ious Coin—Court News.

Henry Haronimus is under arrest on a charge of passing counterfeit money. Haronimus conducts a notion store at 718 Tower avenue. He was arraigned in municipal court late yesterday afternoon and upon entering a plea of not guilty, the case was adjourned until October 19.

J. D. Callihan, who made the complaint, claims that he had business dealings with Haronimus in which he was paid some money by the latter, and that among the currency was a bad dollar. Upon discovering the counterfeit coin he took it back to Haronimus, but he refused to make it good. The dollar, which was exhibited in court, is a very poor counterfeit.

Five South End boys—Mike Femiski, Frank Femiski, Eli Young, Robert Scott, and George Crovin—were arraigned in municipal court yesterday, on a charge of using firearms within the city limits.

It seems the boys were out hunting with rifles of small calibre two of them being in one party and three in another. They were shooting in the vicinity of Twenty-eighth street, when to test his marksmanship one of the boys shot and killed a hen from a nearby poultry yard. Another of the boys, it is alleged, sent a bullet through the hat of a passerby. With the exception of Frank Femiski and Eli Young who were released, the boys were fined \$1 and cost.

The case of Andrew Anderson, charged with a serious offense by a superior woman, was adjourned until October 17.

John Shea was arraigned yesterday on a charge of drunkenness and with interfering with Officer Grant when the latter attempted to arrest him. He was fined ten dollars.

Thomas Pearson, a Billings Park boy, has been taken to Waukesha on a charge of incorrigibility. He had been on parole from the municipal court for some time, but his conduct lately has not been of the best.
