

JEWISH FEAST OF TABERNACLE WILL END WITH SERVICES

Concluding the Jewish holiday season which began Sept. 21, services will be conducted this morning and tonight in all synagogues, in observance of what is known as the rejoicing of the law. This feast is commemorative of the giving of the law to the Jews and is characterized by jubilee celebrations.

Last night marked the end of the eight-day observance of Succoth, the Feast of the Tabernacle. Next on the list of holidays is Pesach (Pass-over) beginning March 30, 1915, and continuing for one week.

Tonight the special services in Adas Israel synagogue will supplement those of last night which were well attended despite the unfavorable weather.
