

DULUTH JEWS WILL START WAR RELIEF

Fund Will Be Collected—Colonel
Graves' Fund Grows to
\$651.50, Is Report.

Following prayers for peace offered in Adas Israel synagogue during the feast of the tabernacle services, orthodox Jews of Duluth have united in the nation-wide movement to give relief to widows and orphans of the Jewish soldiers of the warring European countries.

A committee was appointed yesterday morning to solicit subscriptions that will be forwarded to leaders in the work at New York. Rabbi I. Teplitz and Max Zalk, president of Adas Israel synagogue, are in charge of the campaign here.

According to their plans the city will be divided into districts and every Jewish resident will be asked to donate.
