

B'NAI B'RITH PLANS

AID FOR REFUGEES

Jews, Fleeing From War-Torn Countries of Europe, May Be Brought to U. S.

Covenant lodge No. 569, Independent Order of B'nai B'rith, plans to join the nation-wide movement to aid distressed Jews fleeing from European countries ravaged by war. At the conclusion of the present conflict a great influx of foreigners is anticipated.

At their first meeting of the season in the Holland hotel last night 20 members of the lodge signified their willingness to assist in bringing European immigrants onto farms in the western states. The work is to be carried on by the B'nai B'rith order in every one of the larger cities in the United States.

Arrangements also were made for B'nai B'rith day, Friday, Oct. 30, when the lodge will entertain at least two speakers from the Twin Cities. The occasion is an annual one in the order and gives an opportunity for a comprehensive review of the year's work.

In the absence of Dr. Lefkovits the pulpit at Temple Emanuel will be filled by a member of the congregation on that night. Dr. Lefkovits will be in Cincinnati to attend the meeting of the executive committee of the conference of rabbis. Last year Rabbi Delnard of Minneapolis was principal speaker on B'nai B'rith day.

Following the business meeting a banquet was served, J. J. Robinson, president of the organization, presiding as toastmaster. Informal remarks were delivered by Dr. Maurice Lefkovits, A. B. Kapplin, C. D. Oreckowsky and Solomon Sax of Eveleth.

Dr. Lefkovits outlined a plan for a series of papers to be delivered this winter by a number of the members, using for a general subject "The History of the Jew" and dealing with the race and its progress in every country of the world.
