

13 ARE INDICTED BY GRAND JURY

Two No True Bills Returned
After Two-Day Investiga-
tion by Nov. Inquisitors.

FIVE INDICTMENTS KEPT
SECRET UNTIL ARRESTS

All Prisoners Will Be Arraigned
Today—Trials Will Be
Started Nov. 16.

• In its first and final report submitted to District Judge Cant yesterday the November grand jury returned 13 indictments and two no true bills. Five of the indictments are secret and will remain so until the accused are in custody. The jury made its report to Judge Cant owing to the temporary absence of Judge Dancer, who has charge of the November calendar.

The work of the jury was completed in record time, only two days having been taken in investigation of the cases which were presented by Mason M. Forbes, assistant county attorney. All of those indicted who are in custody will be arraigned before Judge Dancer today. Trial of the indictments will begin on Nov. 16, according to the assistant county attorney.

Harry Veras is charged with assault in the first degree. He is alleged to have shot Morris Daneiko with a revolver on Oct. 7 at 529½ West Michigan street.

Otto Carlson is indicted for grand larceny in the second degree for the alleged theft of a \$75 ring and \$9 bracelet from Anna Winkler at her room, 204 West Third street, Sept. 21.

Valentine Kryznarich is charged with grand larceny in the second degree. He is accused of the theft of a watch valued at \$22 and \$5 from Mike Joseph, Oct. 17, at Joseph's room, 703 West Superior street. Both had been drinking. When Joseph complained to his landlord that he had been robbed, the former threw him out of the lodging house, breaking his arm.

Benjamin Terry, accused of grand larceny in the second degree, is alleged to have snatched a \$35 ring from the purse of Bertha Kuettel while she was getting on a car Oct. 21.

Emil Salo, John Raski and Oscar Kartin are indicted for robbery in the first degree. The trio, indicted jointly, are alleged, on Oct. 6, to have held up and robbed Victor Suilo of a watch valued at \$10, while he was intoxicated.

Frank Camasso is charged with assault in the second degree, it being alleged that on Sept. 28 he stabbed John Ocharuk with a knife.

Nick Yelich, indicted for arson in the second degree, is alleged on Oct. 25, to have set fire to a frame building at 1540 Ninety-seventh avenue West, which was occupied at the time by Mary Lemaras.

John O'Donnell, Emil Ott and Charles Patton are indicted for burglary in the third degree. On Oct. 12, it is alleged, that they broke into a Northern Pacific freight car for the purpose of committing larceny.
