STATISTICS PROVE STUDENTS' WORK

**"Jack" Osherman, Hibbing High
Sophomore, Rated Highest
in the School.**

HIBBING, Oct. 31.—A statement of the grades secured by the students of the Lincoln high school was issued today by the faculty, for the second month of the 1914-15 year. The highest honors were taken by "Jack" Osherman of the sophomore class, with an average standing of 95.1-5. Edwin Friedman, also a sophomore, is a close second with 95. Others above 93 were: Rosalind Dye and Alice Hoskins, both seniors, with 94½ and 93½ respectively; Helen Carlson, junior, Florence Daly, sophomore and Gordon Crowle, freshman, each 93.

The report of the faculty shows that the percentage of failures is a trifle over six, which is considered very low. There are 267 pupils enrolled in the high school. There were 1,133 grades given out, of which there were 74 failures, or standings below 75 per cent. There were 218 pupils passing in all their work. The report shows a great improvement for the freshman and sophomore classes over the September report.
