

# ALLEGED THIEF TO BE BROUGHT BACK

## Deputy Sheriff Now After Harry Goldfine, Arrested in Jersey City.

Governor McGovern Saturday issued a requisition to the governor of New Jersey for the extradition of Harry Goldfine, who is wanted here for the theft of 250 pounds of butter from a Northern Pacific freight car and \$300 worth of shoes from a Soo line freight car.

Deputy Sheriff Carl Norquist left Thursday for Elizabeth, N. J., where Goldfine was arrested, and will await the issuance of the extradition papers.

Edward and Louis Buffey, proprietors of a grocery store at 528 Hughitt avenue, were arrested on Feb. 11 on the charge of stealing the butter. When arraigned before Judge Parker they said the butter was purchased from Goldfine, a peddler, who said he bought it in the country. They received 50 pounds of butter, paying 27 cents a pound, the market price. Goldfine, it is said, visited them on Saturday, Feb. 7, and attempted to sell 100 pounds more of the butter at 22 cents. The brothers became suspicious and refused to buy. When arrested they pleaded not guilty to the charge of larceny.
