GAMBLERS FAIL TO SHOW UP FOR TRIAL

Eight Prefer Forfeiting Bail to Facing Judge on "Tiger Bucking" Charges.

Eight Superior young men, arrested late the night of March 21 by Patrolmen Angvik and Widness in the back room of the city cigar store on Tower avenue while "bucking - the tiger," preferred forfeiting \$15 bail each to appearing in municipal court before Judge Parker on charges of gambling.

When the judge reached consideration of their cases in court yesterday, none of the defendants was present, and their bail was declared forfeited.

Those arrested gave the following names: Adolph Brown, George Young, A. Johnson, Jim Jones, Mike Sher, William Schalkopf, John Larson and George Webster. One man escaped through the front door of the store when the officers entered stealthily while the "black Maria" waited without in a carefully arranged raid. No money was found around the card table.

It is thought that some of the defendants gave fictitious names to the police. Michael Sher, 1203 North Sixth street, asked that it be announced that he was not among those arrested. He thinks some one of those caught in the dragnet used his name as a blind.
